Governor Walz ends his ban on Hydroxychloroquine (HCQ) to Treat Covid-19



Minnesota doctors are now permitted to prescribe HCQ to COVID-19 patients and it can be filled at Minnesota pharmacies.

Governor Walz lifted his March 27, 2020 Executive Order 20-23 restrictions on Chloroquine and Hydroxychloroquine. On August 12, 2020 Governor Walz's Executive Order 20-84 rescinded his previous ban on Chloroquine and Hydroxychloroquine. His order states: "The authorization for the Minnesota Board of Pharmacy to implement dispensing limitations related to these medicines is no longer necessary and can be rescinded..." (Paragraph 5 of Executive Order 20-23)

This is good news for COVID-19 patients. Many physicians across the nation, and various researchers around the world have found early use of Hydroxychloroquine shortens illness, reduces symptoms, and keeps patients out of the hospital and off ventilators. For many patients, Hydroxychloroquine has been a life-saving medication. Please refer to my article in Candy's Report Volume II, where a large group of physicians across

the United States all confirmed that the course of treatment using Hydroxychloroquine was shown to be highly effective in treating their COVID-19 patients.

Minnesota's Largest Police Organization Pulls Support for DFL, Backs Republicans in Key Swing Districts

On September 10, 2020, the Star Tribune reported that Minnesota's largest law enforcement organization, the Minnesota Police and Peace Officers Association (MPPOA), has withdrawn endorsements from "several" DFL incumbents, and backed several Republicans in high



profile races. Support for men and women of law enforcement used to be a bipartisan issue at the Capitol. Unfortunately, Democrats have embraced a fringe agenda of abolishing, defunding, and even disarming our peace officers.

This shift in support marks a major change for the MPPOA, which has historically spent heavily to support DFL candidates with campaign contributions and independent expenditures.

Minneapolis City Council abandons its push to defund the police



In June, nine members of the Minneapolis City Council announced their support for de-funding the Minneapolis Police Department and replacing it with a community-based public safety model. The City Council members were explicit that this meant ending the Minneapolis Police Department. Council president Lisa Bender stated that she and eight other council members were committed "to end policing as we know it and recreate systems that actually keep us safe." Council member Ellison said, "this council is going to dismantle this police department."

But the Minneapolis City Council's resolve to end the city's police department has lost momentum, the result of the failure to get the question before voters in November and council members' diverging ideas on the role of sworn officers in the future.

It is also, no doubt, a reaction to the spike in violence which is rocking the city at present.
